

We are ecstatic this event has become a yearly tradition and we hope to host it every winter for years to come!










COMMUNITY SERVICE AND PHILANTHROPY

Beginning with philanthropy, our chapter has made drastic improvements within the last calendar year. For the 2016-2017 year, we raised a total of \$10,551.87 for the Hunstman Cancer Foundation and \$300.00 for the Sigma Chi Foundation. To put these numbers in perspective, this is over quadruple what we have been averaging over the past several years. To help reach these totals during the winter term, we sold ticket packages for the Flint Firebirds, a local OHL Hockey Team in their inaugural season. Due to our hard work and the energy we brought to the bleachers, the Firebirds presented us with additional free tickets for brothers for future games.

On the community service side, this past term we expanded upon our relationship with the Flint Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center. At this location, the Salvation Army helps rehabilitate those struggling with drug addictions and alcoholism, through a six-month program that focuses on personal rejuvenation. With nearly three dozen brothers in attendance at this event, we split into groups to help unload and sort donations, clean delivery trucks, and clear a section of land for a vegetable garden.

Beyond Salvation Army, we helped set-up, coordinate, manage, and clean-up the Flushing Shillelagh Run in mid-March. This is a four-mile race hosted in the same city as our chapter house, and it allows us to demonstrate Sigma Chi's commitment to serve the local community.







With forty-three active brothers, the physical brotherhood is the largest it has been in recent memory. To take advantage of this, we have been creating multiple intramural sports teams for each league at Kettering University, both for competitiveness and leisure. It has been an excellent way to rush potential new members, but this term functioned as an excellent way for pledges to assimilate into our chapter prior to initiation. Our most noteworthy sports accomplishment this winter was repeating as water polo champions. Our team was undefeated, and swam circles around the competition.

The Brotherhood Chairs also set-up our yearly Super Bowl event. We project the game in our cafe and order five-hundred wings for the big game. In addition to that, they scheduled an afternoon at the Joe Dumar's Field House for some whirly-ball and putt-putt golf fun towards the end of the term.

Another event that we brought back is the Florida Spring Break Trip. Twenty-one brothers caravanned down to Panama City Beach for the week and rented a beach house. On their way down to the Panhandle State, they planned to stop at other chapter houses to meet various Sigs from Michigan to Georgia and all over the I-75 corridor.
