The first half of the 2017-2018 year was extraordinarily productive regarding the service efforts of our chapter. Over the course of the summer work and fall school terms, there were 15 organized community service events which the brotherhood participated in. Many brothers have gone above and beyond and become heavily involved in the community through on-campus organizations as well as participating in the events we have as a brotherhood. In total, our chapter's efforts have yielded 1450 hours of service in both Flint and Flushing communities, as well as individual brother's local communities. This comes out to an average of 37.18 hours per brother. 

1855 Club and NFI Subscription:


