COMMUNITY SERVICE AND PHILANTHROPY


We are extremely proud to announce that for the 2017-2018 year, we raised \$20,054.49 for the Huntsman Cancer Foundation and \$300 for the Sigma Chi Foundation. Our Philanthropy Chairs and Derby Daddies lead us to great success and innovated many new fundraising methods that will help us continue to succeed in philanthropy. These events included a Detroit Tigers Outing, a golf outing, and an on-campus 5k that drew fantastic alumni involvement.

The brothers of Zeta Theta A are always working to give back to the Flushing and Flint communities. We each aim to perform at least 12 hours of community service every 6 months, and as a house managed to perform 455.25 total hours of service, over 15 hours per brother. In Flint, we held a Road Side Clean-Up Event on Flushing Road, splitting into teams to clean 2.4 miles of road.

In Flushing, we again volunteered to help set up and manage the Shillelagh Run, a 4-mile race hosted in Flushing just blocks away from home. Runners included local Kettering faculty and alumni brother Casey Masters.









In Intramurals, we had great success in basketball and in water polo, and found ourselves the champions of R-tourney basketball. We hoped to continue our reign of terror as 2-term champions of water polo, however the season was sadly cancelled halfway through.

Over the term, board games took off in popularity. A game of Settlers of Catan or Betrayal at House on the Hill found their into the library multiple times a week. Even during finals week, you could always find a game going, looking for additional members.

For our annual spring break trip 13 brothers found their way down to Surf City, North Carolina. In Surf City brothers filled their days with fishing, sand castle building, and long walks on the beach. Some intrepid alumni took some time out of their busy schedules to fly down and enjoy an exciting, seafood-filled time with us.







This term we continued our excellent representation on campus, and forged stronger bonds with the other Greek organizations of Kettering. Our brothers are found in all areas of leadership on campus: as the Sophomore Representative within student government, the IFC philanthropy chair, and on the executive committees of numerous clubs including GEO club, Pre-Med Club, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, and the Kettering Entrepreneur Society, among many others.
