The estimated cost of this project is approximately \$10,000. We hope that with strong, early support, we can earn enough money to get started on this project right away. We were targeting to have this kitchen refresh completed by the 55th, but due to low funds we could not support the start. The new estimated completion for the project is by the end of the year.

With this past fall term coming to a close, I am proud to share our chapter's achievements and am eager to see what's to come in the remainder of the school year. First and foremost, building on the recruiting success we had last year, our recruitment team was able to offer 26 bids to prospective new members. 24 of these bids were returned on the first available day, followed by a late acceptance of one prospective new member, resulting in a class of 25 heading into pledging. With pledging being reduced to a 5 week program, our Magister, Nick Tuttle ('22), and the entire chapter are excited to develop these ambitious individuals into the next leaders of Kettering University, and the Zeta Theta B chapter.

Our continued dedication to the community around us stays in the forefront of our minds and is represented in the progress we have made to both our philanthropic, and community service goals for the year. New philanthropy events and a revamping of our traditional haunted house has lead us to raising approximately \$8,000 for the Huntsman Cancer foundation. This is \$3,800 more than in previous years, and our philanthropy team is excited to continue pushing to reach our \$20,000 goal by the end of the school year. In addition, we have peaked just over half way to our 2,000 hour community service goal. With many brothers taking on community service opportunities over this work term, I have no doubt that this goal will be exceeded in the coming months. It is amazing to see the commitment to our ideals, not only during our terms in school, but back in many individual's hometowns and personal lives as well.

Our efforts on campus have also grow over the past months. Most notably, Brother Ryan Grifka ('21) was elected as the IFC Vice President and Brother Curtis Bartz ('22) was elected as the Kettering Student Government Vice President. These roles serve a crucial part of running both greek life on campus and the three councils of Kettering Student Government. Scholarship Update




